Does Satan Fly A UFO?

An Essay

Looking for escape from the daily routine, or maybe something new to fantasize about during those private moments? How about virgin sacrifice, cannibalism, electronic controls in penises, people floating through solid walls, hot tub abduction trauma therapy and rape by long distance? If any of these warm your cockles, let me introduce you to the twin erotic zones of UFO true believers and Satanist cult cops.

After flying radar interceptors during the cold war, spending two decades running security for a company with more than a hundred military and civilian sites (some plain, some classified) and rubbing shoulders with people from the FBI, CIA, NSA and various other acronyms, it was natural for me to segue from spook work to investigating UFOs and aliens. I refer, of course, to the little green men that later became little gray men and started kidnapping trailer trash and performing strange operations on them, taking samples of jism from the guys and sticking some kind of probes up vaginas presumably to get reproductive material for creating a race of human/alien mutants. folks that hung around the trailer park or someone who already had a self-esteem problem. So I started nosing around.

I can tell you first hand that what you run into when you're talking to the "true believers" is the infinitely weird. True believers are those who really believe space aliens have visited us and have contacted the anointed few. In trying to find something that would stand up in court, so to speak, I kept running out of leads. In talking to other UFOologists who had their heads screwed on tight, I learned the reason why. To put it plainly, *no one has ever produced for scientific examination a single piece of scientifically-verifiable evidence that space aliens have visited the Earth.* However, this irrefutable fact doesn't keep the true believers from claiming otherwise. But if you ask them for proof, like the kind that you could take to a lab where a real scientist could look at it, they get testy as hell. They claim that the U. S. government has confiscated all the evidence and kept it secret from the media and the public for fifty years.

So what would be the biggest news story in history, the story that would alter humankind's perception of itself, change our concept of science, and blow the fundamentalist's brains right out of their asses and the government has kept it out of the papers for fifty years? Yeh, sure! Believe me, I worked in security for twenty years and there's no way the U. S. government can keep a juicy secret out of the Washington Post for six months, much less fifty years.

While perusing the morning paper a while back, I ran across an interesting story that included the name of a very strange chap I knew from way back. Now get this! When I knew him, this bird was a hell-raiser first class, womanizer

with whosoever's wife, boozier deluxe and collector of macabre Nazi stuff like swords, uniforms and Jewish soap, if you get my meaning. It turns out this guy is now running a "Christian retreat," quoting the Bible every other breath and tracking down Satan worshippers.

To shorten the story, I got into investigating Satanist cults, or to state it more accurately, investigating the cult cops who are supposed to investigate the Satan cults. But guess what, *there are no Satan-worshipping cults* in the good old U. S. A. But there *are* plenty of people who write books about them and there are publishers who couldn't give a damn about the truth and cater to the public's not-so-secret sadomasochistic fantasies.

Back in the eighties, it was trendy for Oprah and Donahue to parade young female "survivors" of Satanist cults in front of their goggle-eyed audiences. These chicks got their audiences all worked up with tales about ritual rape, group molestation, torture, cannibalism and human sacrifice. These gals and their "therapists" claimed that 3,000 Satanist cults sacrificed 50,000 people a year to Auld Scratch. (Who keeps these stats, the Satan's Central Accounting Office or maybe Guinness?) Being a logical person, you might ask, "Why doesn't someone find at least one of these bodies and drop a dime on these dudes?" The cult cops' answer is that the Satan worshippers are so good at devouring, burning or otherwise disposing of their victims' remains, there isn't a shred of forensic evidence left. If that sounds familiar, you're right! The UFOologists and the cult cops sound amazingly alike. And that isn't all; I found that the little gray guys in the spaceships and Auld Harney's demons share some very peculiar and kinky

predispositions. In fact, I think they are the same bunch of horny little buggers.

Just ask senior UFOologist Stanton Friedman, the godfather of the Roswell incident. (He and a loopy former, non-pilot Air Force major parlayed a weather balloon radar reflector into a crashed space ship.) If you ask Stanton about the lack of credible evidence of extraterrestrial visitation, he will pull out a Carl Sagan quotation that originally pertained to the possibility of life on other planets, "The absence of evidence is not evidence of absence." When someone asked big time cult cop Police Lieutenant Lawrence Haake the same thing, according to the Richmond (Virginia) News Leader, Haake said, "No evidence can be evidence," Want to see a prosecutor sell that one to a jury?

Forget the Equations Newtie, There's No Law of Physics

But the thing that will really blow your mind is that both Satanists and the little gray men can tell Isaac Newton to get stuffed! Old Isaac's laws of physics don't affect them in the least.

Researcher Dan Wright made a presentation to the Mutual UFO Network, an organization of true believers, on a study he conducted of UFO abductees. It involved 560 tape transcripts on 142 subjects claiming to have been abducted by UFOs. Wright reported that 32% of the subjects said that they and/or the aliens were able to pass through solid walls or windows while on their way to cosmic molestation sessions. Nearly 53% reported they

were “floated up” into the UFO, and nearly half of these were levitated via a beam of light. Only 9% reported using more prosaic methods such as walking or using steps.

Jon Trott, editor of the religious quarterly *Cornerstone*, found that Satanists put their defiance of physics to more glandular uses. He was told by a distraught parent involved in an alleged daycare ritual abuse case, “Satanists can do anything. (The suspect) raped my daughter on Thursday afternoon, and he was in a city three hundred miles away at that same time!” Trott, doubting his ears, said, “You don’t mean he was in both places simultaneously?” “Oh yes!” she exclaimed. “Both places. Satanists can do anything.”

Among certain non-Satanists, such abilities would be held in high regard. One male chauvinist acquaintance of mine posed a scenario to me: “Imagine sitting on the sofa beside the wife watching *CSI*, while simultaneously screwing the brains out of a topless dancer down at the local Motel 6.”

You Just Can’t Find A Decent HMO Anymore!

Another disturbing similarity between the two scams is the handling of medical treatment for UFO abductees and cult survivors.

In his book *In Pursuit of Satan*, anthropologist and former Navy cryptologist Robert D. Hicks relates the story of a cult survivor called “Angel” who was treated by two psychologists for mental trauma. In an unpublished paper obtained by Hicks, the psychologists cataloged the horrors that Angel allegedly endured while being held in thrall by a Satanist cult. According to the paper, “Angel related how

holes were dug in the back of her head and in various other parts of her body. There the electrodes were implanted. Then the switch would be turned on and off." Inexplicably, the "therapists" failed to mention examining their patient's body for this mutilation or taking her to a medical doctor for removal of the fiendish devices. (The straight-laced Hicks tantalizes us by omitting the effect of the "on" switch. Did it get Angel lubed up and ready to party or was she programmed to cut throats?)

This aversion to competent medical care shows up in the literature on alien abductions as well. Of all the "monitoring" or "tracking" devices that allegedly have been implanted in thousands of abductees, there is no record in legitimate scientific circles of any alien device submitted for competent technical examination. Thank goodness UFO-abduction guru Budd Hopkins shared an explanation of this evidential gap at the October 1994 conference on UFOs in Pensacola, Florida. Hopkins explained that while aliens implant tracking devices in the brain, nose, ear, chest, leg or even the penis of some abductees, very few of the devices show up on x-ray or CAT-scan. He said, "If they ever do show up on an x-ray or CAT-scan, within a day or so, before there is any ability (sic) to try to recover them, they disappear." Then he added, with a straight face, "The aliens seem to have a little alarm bell that goes off in the sky and they come and remove the object."

Oddly enough, Hopkins offers no explanation as to why the patient is not isolated and guarded until a terrestrial physician can perform surgery. More importantly, Hopkins failed to tell his audience where the aliens find male

abductees so robustly equipped they need a CAT-scan to tell them that old Willy is sporting a tracking device.

The caliber of care for abductees is nowhere more apparent than in the case of Dr. Richard O'Boyle, Past President of the Sacramento Valley Psychological Association, and a renowned UFO-abduction specialist. He got in trouble with two of his younger and shapelier female patients, neither of whom knew about the other. First he stunned them by announcing his diagnosis: they suffered from traumatic amnesia because they had been abducted by space aliens. But what really pissed them off was that the treatment he prescribed was joining him naked in hot-tub therapy sessions. The California State Board promptly lifted O'Boyle's license. An active UFOologist informed me that the defrocked therapist now raises money for the Republican Party.

The Truth, the Whole Truth and Nuttin' But the Truth

When the true believers and the cult cops start telling their stories, look out! Separating the truth from psychosexual fantasies is a problem for the uninitiated. On the other hand, the experienced researcher knows if a true believer is awake, he's lying. Consider the following tidbits.

Lauren Stratford, author of the book *Satan's Underground*, tells a horrifying story of being held by a Satanist cult as a teenage "breeder" and giving birth to three babies that were sacrificed to Satan. *Cornerstone* magazine, taking a healthily skeptical view of her claims, fielded a trio of investigators to check out the author's background and published the results as "The True Lauren Stratford Story". Among other things, the investigators found that during the period when

Stratford was supposed to be giving birth to three babies, she had been singing with friends in Pentecostal church groups, attending Christian schools and living with family members, none of whom had ever seen her pregnant. And, get this! Her husband assured investigators she was a virgin when she came to the marriage bed.

At one time the hottest UFO "abduction" case was that of Travis Walton, who allegedly was abducted by an alien craft on November 5, 1975 near Heber, Arizona, an abduction "witnessed" by six coworkers, and the basis for the movie "Fire in the Sky". The yarn won for Walton's forestry crew the National Enquirer's Award of \$5,000 for the Best UFO Story of the Year. However, Phillip Klass, former senior editor of the prestigious *Aviation Week and Space Technology* magazine who conducted a fruitless 30-year search for scientific proof of alien visitation, revealed in his meticulously researched book *UFOs, The Public Deceived* of doctored polygraphs and the Enquirer's suppression of another polygraph showing that Walton was full of shit. Phil Klass tracked down Steve Pierce, the youngest member of Walton's forestry crew and a "witness" to the "abduction", after the young man moved out of Arizona and away from the jurisdiction of the Sheriff who headed up the official search for Walton. When questioned by Klass, Pierce said that Travis Walton had not even shown up for work the day of the "abduction," claiming to be ill. It follows that no one saw Walton get abducted. The somewhat obtuse Pierce admitted to Klass that he thought the whole thing was a hoax. He said, "If I could ever prove it was a hoax, I'd damn sure do it."

In a case investigated by yours truly*, and one that spent years in the courts, two female social workers' psycho-sexual obsessions with child molesting, pornography and Satanist cults led to an incident in the piney woods that proved bizarre even by Texas standards. A police force sergeant who was investigating the disappearance of a teen-aged girl was indicted along with six others by a cult-cop team, despite the total lack of physical evidence, for the missing girl's kidnapping, rape and ritual murder. According to the star witness, a retarded woman frightened into rehearsed testimony, the Satanic robe-wearing cult gang-raped and molested the girl for ten days, stabbed her to death, cut off her breasts and cut out her "private parts", dismembered her and processed the body for cooking. The team of self-styled "cult cops," which included a born-again special prosecutor, a scripture-quoting investigator and the sex-obsessed social workers, got control of the grand jury and was preparing indictments of the police chief, most of the sheriff's department and the local dog catcher when the Texas Attorney General's office intervened. State officials conducted their own investigation and, finding the whole plot to be a product of the social workers' lubricious imaginations, put a stop to the entire affair. The sergeant sued his former tormentors for \$20,000,000 in federal court. He was unsuccessful because Texas law lets prosecutors get away with practically anything.

Harvard psychiatrist John E. Mack wrote a best seller about intergalactic molestation titled *Abduction*. My favorite

story from the book is about a hypnotic-regression subject called Scott. Scott related an abduction story that, to the layman, sounds suspiciously like a high-tech wet dream. Dr. Mack reports: "The beings placed a 'faucet thing, like a suction' over Scott's penis...He saw more light in the room now, and for the first time...spoke of the 'wires' applied to his testicles. It was these wires, Scott observed, in combination with the suction device over his penis that stimulated his erection and were 'making it happen' and 'taking things out' - i. e., his sperm." (Most people, not having the advantage of being a Harvard psychiatrist, might recommend that Scott could avoid such dreams by getting himself a couple of sleazy photos of an electronics lab and a milking machine and just whacking off more often.) Dr. Mack tells us that the nasty little space freaks also abducted Scott's little sister Lee. The randy buggers took her aboard a UFO, inserted a probe into her vagina and removed a bit of tissue, "perhaps an egg." Ten days later, she departed for India to study Tibetan Buddhism.

Suspicious Confirmed

If you are not yet convinced that UFO hucksters and Satan-chasers are cloned out of the same Petri dish, consider this: Tales of alien abduction and attendant sexual molestation are eerily reminiscent of sixteenth century incubus stories.

Medieval literature says that Satan's incubi would spirit away innocent young girls in the night, ravage them practically to death with strange and misshapen phalli, and return them to their beds exhausted and fraught with guilt. Female demons, the succubae, visited pious young men in

the wee hours and “sucked away their life force,” or in simpler terms, gave them colossal orgasms. These unholy unions produced misshapen changelings that were substituted for human children abducted by the demons. Similarly, abduction proponents maintain that present-day aliens carry away their victims for the extraction of sperm and ova for use in creating a race of alien/human hybrids that now walk among us! These tales are too much alike to be a coincidence. The preponderance of circumstantial evidence convinces me that so-called space aliens, in actuality, are Satan’s demons disguised in shiny Spandex!
