Introduction

The Internet was designed as a medium for business and networking in between several servers, within the same company, to provide the quickest and easiest method of exchanging of information. However, other aspects have been discovered for more of a commercial use, thus the birth of the world wide web.

People with a computer, modem, server, and money had developed their own Internet Service Provider network. The ancestors of the modern ISPs would provide the connection to the Internet for so much money per hour for the privilege of using their gateway. The user would also be given an email address for Internet communications, which would consist of the user name “@” the Internet Service Provider name “.” com or net. The only way to access the Internet was through a LAN line aka a home telephone line. . . . known as dial-up.

As time went on, ISPs came and gone, and prices had also changed. The user could get unlimited access for a set rate. The user would get email, newsgroups, chat and web space. Other types of connections had also been developed, DSL, Cable, T1, etc., but the prices for these connections had also risen in the beginning. But as competition risen between providers, the prices has also dropped. What once cost \$20 a month for dial-up, a customer could use DSL or CABLE connections for about the same pricing and over 50 times faster.

The overall purpose of the Internet still hadn't changed, it's still used for connecting people with people and business applications, but it had opened a new world of danger. Cyber predators, leeches and other parasites had risen to wreak havoc on unexpecting web surfers.

Overview

This book was designed to be a survival guide against the various types of scams that are portrayed on the Internet. As a victim, I know, now, what methods that I should have had taken to further protect myself against these online cockroaches.

I will explain the various types of scams that are the most popular and that have the largest toll of victims. I will explain my DDD (triple D) method. I will also explain how to **d**etect the potential scammer and scam, how to **d**efend yourself from being a victim and to **d**eter away from a possible dangerous situation.

Keep in mind that the scammer would be the most aggressive salesman that anyone had ever dealt with in any environment. Scammers will use a number of techniques from mild begging to out right guilt trips and threats. The scammers usually work in small groups with only one goal. . . . take your hard earned money. I personally know several people that had been taken for anywhere in between \$5,000 to \$300,000 and they will never see that money again!

Always question the person on the other end, be very skeptical, and keep all of your personal and private information to yourself. Above all if you are scammed or think that you are being scam, DO NOT feel ashamed or afraid to report it or to ask for help.
