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CHAPTER TEN

WHERE MAY HUMANS BE TOMORROW (TOMORROW)

As we Humans look ahead and plan for the Future, what can we expect, and how do we need to adjust to suit the Future? What problems lie ahead, that need to be resolved for the Future?

A major problem that continues to unfold is the Holocene extinction (10,000 BC — Ongoing). The problems of religious differences and racial differences require us citizens of the World to accept and promote: that we all worship the one God of our Universe; and that we are all cousins of each other, regardless of our color.
