In the project's first month, Bonnie had captured and released five bears. She had fitted each with a radio collar. Now she radio tracked two yearling males, two adult males, and one yearling female. After seeing this new paw print, Bonnie eagerly prepared to trap the new big male.

By late October, Bonnie still had not caught the bear. In spite of seeing his tracks at almost every site, she only found the traps sprung and the bait taken. She continued setting traps almost daily.

It had not been so difficult capturing the other bears. A drought had gripped this lower Chihuahua desert for several years. Natural food sources such as acorns and Mexican persimmons were scarce.
