BLENDER

Matthew 19:5 ...For this reason a man will leave his father and mother and be united to his wife, and the two will become one flesh.

John 17:21-22 that all of them [disciples] may be one, Father, just as you are in me and I am in you. May they also be in us so that the world may believe that you have sent me.

When my daughters were being honored with bridal showers, I gave each a blender. I had stressed that in a marriage two people's lives should blend into one. They were aware of a blender's capabilities, having used mine. They were familiar with how several distinct ingredients would unite into one as the blender worked, sometimes hitting rough spots and sometimes running smoothly, but always blending into one. It was not just a gift; it was a symbol.

A blender is a perfect gift for a bride-to-be. It can be used as a continual reminder that the Lord wants the blending of two lives into harmony.

Jesus had the same desire for his disciples in John 17:21-22 as he prayed for His disciples. He desired that they all be one. He desired unity. That is not asking uniformity -- all being just alike -- but united in the Lord.

Prayer: Lord, I pray for the husbands and wives to be as one. For those alone, I pray for them to have unity with others of the faith. In the name of Jesus, I pray. Amen.

VANILLA

Psalm 51:10 Create in me a clean heart, O God, and renew a right spirit within me.

James 4:8a Come near to God and he will come near to you. b Wash your hands, you sinners, and purify your hearts, you double-minded.

My vanilla bottle is labeled "Pure Vanilla." It's not imitation. It has no impurities in it. It contains 100% vanilla.

"Pure" brings to my mind the heart and the need for having a pure heart before our Lord and Savior. Often the words of Psalm 51:10 have come to me, just as if out of nowhere -- "Create in me a clean heart, O God, and renew a right spirit within me." I long to be pure.

At the end of the process, we put our lives "onto the pan." Some things have become part of our lives, and those things, just like the impressions of the cookie cutter, are marks of our lives. We may influence others whose lives are being shaped. We can be a good effect or not.

Jesus says to let our light shine. We are influences, hopefully for good for Christ. We have all kinds of wonderful reminders by Jesus to make good marks or impressions on others. May the impressions we make on the lives of others be of our letting His light shine through us.

PRAYER: Lord, today, I will make marks on the lives of others -- good or bad. May I leave only a good impression or effect on their lives for Your glory. I pray this, not only just for today, but also for all the days of my life. Amen.
