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Life In 3-D Spring Book (January Through April)

January 1 – New Beginnings

Genesis 1: (Black Bible Marker Ribbon)

How like God to create people with the capacity to understand the things He would reveal to them, in a progressive way, through the centuries of history. These culminate in the ultimate revelation of God the Son in the person of Jesus Christ. Unlike the created angels, we, as people, through the years, were shown more and more of God's plan through His Word, the Bible. Not yet placed in the presence of God's glory, we are offered an everlasting fellowship with God if we accept, by faith, the forgiveness of our sins by the substitutionary death of Jesus and His resurrection from death which was clearly revealed in the New Testament.

Ezra 1: (Blue Bible Marker Ribbon)

Some 460 years before Jesus' birth the Jewish people were offered a chance for a new beginning in their promised land they had been given as stated in the Books of the Law through Moses in Exodus through Deuteronomy. They had brief international prominence under David and Solomon around 1000 BC. Their on-again off-again acceptance then rejection of God's prophets led to the destruction of Israel by Assyria. Some 135 years later Judah was destroyed by the Babylonians. Under the priestly leadership of Ezra they returned to Jerusalem in the second group of Jews to once again live as God's chosen people through whom God would reveal His plan of salvation for all people. This plan of salvation was clearly revealed in the New Testament some 400+ years later.

Psalms 1: (White Bible Marker Ribbon)

Back to around 1000 BC when David wrote the majority of the Psalms, Psalm one contains an outline, given by inspiration of God, of the way our lives can be lived, even today, by beginning again, and again, if necessary (1John 1:9).

Psalms 119:1 – 8: (Silver Bible Marker Ribbon)

Like a many faceted diamond sparkles in many different ways as we rotate it in the sunlight, this, the longest chapter in the Bible, gives us special insight on the power of God's Word in almost every verse. How our heart cries out with the psalmist, in verse five, that we could keep a lifelong direction to our lives by following the guidance found in His Word to us. Today is a wonderful day to begin our focus, or to regain our focus, on God's Word once again.

Proverbs 1: (Gold Bible Marker Ribbon)

How powerfully God poured out His Spirit on Solomon who had asked God for wisdom to rule. We are blessed with some of the wisdom of Solomon as he was the primary author of this book. We today are offered, in verses 22 and 23, the promise of wisdom from God if we are willing

to repent of our sins and to begin again to read God's Word, the Bible, and to seek His guidance for our lives.

Matthew 1: (Red Bible Marker Ribbon)

In His special appeal to the Jewish people, God inspired Matthew, prior to 70 AD, to write an account of Jesus' life and ministry. After following Jesus through His earthly ministry, by witnessing His death on the cross and His resurrection from death, he wrote of Jesus' lineage which included Abraham and David. The Messiah, promised in Scripture through the centuries, will be seen in this and other gospel accounts. Truly Jesus is Emmanuel-God with us.

Romans 1: (Green Bible Marker Ribbon)

About 57 AD, this book written by Paul to the Christians in Rome, has in my opinion, as its central theme, the revelation of how Jesus, and only Jesus, could be the Messiah promised to come in the Old Testament. Paul's ability to distill the essence of the gospel, in verse 16, rings through the centuries down to our present day, that it is the power of God to save a sinner who repents of his sin and accepts Jesus as his Savior and Lord. A sinner can begin a new life as a new spiritually created being who, when his body is shed in death, his spirit will live eternally with God in Heaven in a glorified body as He planned before creation.

Revelation 1:1-3 (Orange Bible Marker Ribbon)

We are promised to be blessed when we read this book. Jesus Christ is revealed to the Apostle John as the creator (Genesis 1:1) and all conquering Ruler of the now fallen Universe.

January 2 Choices

Genesis 2

Verse 17 says that God put a special tree called the tree of the knowledge of good and evil in the garden of Eden. Adam could choose to avoid the tree as God told him to do or he could choose to disobey God and eat its fruit. If man were to be in God's image, he must have a will to obey or to disobey God. God's words of guidance were given to His people to help them to choose the correct way to live. His Word, the Bible, is available to us today so we can read and follow its instruction or avoid it and live our lives, with divine penalty, without His guidance.

Ezra 2

The children of the Jews who had been captured by the Babylonians some 90 years earlier (this was the second wave of returning Jews), could see for themselves the consequences of choosing to ignore God's guidance for their lives found in His Word. These Jews returning to Jerusalem now had a fresh perspective and respect for God's Word. This sea change in attitude toward God's Word was better than ignoring God. But as the years passed, the Jews began to set up a system of traditions that culminated in the religious system, led by the scribes, Pharisees, and Sadducees where they had placed verbal traditions above the clear teachings in God's Word. They incurred Jesus' wrath because they chose to set aside and to ignore God's Word when it conflicted with their traditions.

Psalm 2

This whole Psalm points out the foolishness of ignoring God and His authority over the whole world. Obeying God's Word and worshiping God is the best lifetime investment we can make.

Psalm 119:9 – 16

These are some of the best-known verses in the Bible about the wisdom of memorizing God's Word. Memorized Scripture verses can make us ready to face temptation. Described later, in the New Testament, the Word of God is referred to as the Sword of the Spirit (Ephesians 6:17). We would be well served to use these verses to help us to make right choices in our everyday lives.

Proverbs 2

Do we really want a happy life as we live in an imperfect and sinful world? God, again, speaks through the writings of Solomon, the wisest man who ever lived, to choose to memorize God's Word early in our lives as an invaluable asset for a happy life. This message of applying God's Word throughout our lives is necessary so we will not end up like the cynical Solomon who wrote the book of Ecclesiastes.

Matthew 2

The wonderful plan of God to provide salvation for all people is written here for all to read. God the Son chose to, one day, come to earth as a baby, to live a perfect life, then die on the cross for all mankind. He rose from death so we who believe on Him could regain the spiritual life Adam and Eve lost in the Garden of Eden. This way was planned before creation (1Peter 1:19-20). Mary and Joseph chose to cooperate with God's plan by caring for baby Jesus and were given the means to do so with the gold, frankincense, and myrrh given by the wise men to finance their trip and stay in Egypt to protect the baby Jesus from King Herod.

Romans 2

The Apostle Paul insisted that trusting in Jesus and Him alone is the only way of eternal salvation. This choice, to choose to trust Jesus as our personal savior, is God's plan of salvation that remains the same choice for each of us in our lives to this very day.

Revelation 1:4-8

We can choose to believe that Jesus Christ is the Ruler of the Universe or to disbelieve it but that does not change the fact that He is the eternal Ruler of the Universe.

January 3 God's plan of Redemption

Genesis 3

Adam and Eve were created perfect and also were given a free will. These defining mental and spiritual characteristics separated them from all other created beings. They could be referred to as being made in the image of God. We know, from references in the New Testament, that God the Son had already volunteered to one day die on the cross for all people if they, as we see in this chapter, chose to disobey God and to eat of the fruit of the tree of the knowledge of good and evil. In my opinion, this is the first hint in the Bible of God's redemption plan for people when God clothed Adam and Eve with the skins of animals which required the shedding of blood of innocent animals. This doubtlessly points to the time when Jesus shed His blood on the cross for the sin of all mankind throughout all time (Ephesians 1:4 – 11).

Ezra 3

The returning Jews used the written instructions of Moses, God's Word, to offer burnt offerings of animals that had been killed. This was according to God's instructions. By shedding of their blood, again we see, in the sacrifice of animals, a picture of the redemption plan of God for our sin (Hebrews 9:22).

Psalm 3

David knew his redemption and salvation were from God (verse 8).

Psalm 119:17 – 24

This psalmist, as should we today, cries out to God for revelation of the wonderful things in God's Word (verse 18).

Proverbs 3

Verses 5 and 6 contain one of the most eloquent statements in Proverbs of the value of trusting God and following the instructions in His Word throughout our lives.

Matthew 3

God's redemption plan begins with our repentance of our sin as John the Baptist preached to all who would listen. Since the original sin of Adam, we are all born in a sinful state. For the removal of the penalty of death for our sin, we must repent of our sin and tell God we want the free gift of eternal life He offers by trusting Jesus as our Savior and Lord. This is God's one and only plan for our redemption and for cleansing of our souls so we can go to heaven when our body dies. If we are alive when Jesus comes at the time of the rapture, we will be given our spiritual body and meet Jesus in the air (1 Thessalonians 4:16-17).

Romans 3

In verses 24-25, Paul clearly explains that God's plan of redemption for all people is through our acceptance of Jesus' shed blood on the cross as the only way He can accept us as righteous and thus give us eternal life. It is important to remember that only twice did God ask for human sacrifice. God asked Abraham to sacrifice his son, Isaac, but God was only testing him and had no intention to allow the death of Isaac. The other human sacrifice God demanded was that of His own Son, Jesus (the only God- man). His death on the cross was required to satisfy God's justification to save all of mankind who are all guilty sinners before Him. God does righteously demand that every sinner cry out to Jesus to forgive their sin and cleanse them from their vile unrighteousness. The Christian religion has been called a bloody religion in the past. But unlike many religions that required human sacrifice, none was ever demanded by God except that of His Own Son.

Revelation 1:9-20

Jesus Christ is the living eternal being who is the only one who can save us from death and hell (verses 17-19). He and only He can save us when we ask Him to forgive our sin and to change us to make us able to live forever with Him in heaven, which is His perfect plan for our redemption (John 3:16).

The Epic Deception The real Star Wars.

A long, long time ago in a period known as eternity past, there existed a being known as the God of the universe (Genesis 1:1) (John 1:1) (Revelation 1:4-8) (Revelation 21:6-7) (Revelation 22:12).

God was a being functioning in three parts, God the Father, God the Son (later known as Jesus), and God the Holy Spirit, (1 John 5:7) (Matthew 3:16-17), who are in perfect harmony and held together with a powerful force known as love (1 John 4:8). After creating beings known as angels who were to be His servants and messengers and to worship Him, God chose to make plans to create beings in His image (Genesis 1:26-27). He planned not only to give humans eternal life (John 3:16), but also to be able to produce other humans and give them dominion over the whole earth.

God would allow them to live on earth in a measure called time. Time would end at some point in history then continue as eternity future (Revelation 1:3-8), (Revelation 11:15), (Revelation 22:5): (1 Corinthians 6:3).

THE BEGINNING OF THE REBELLION

Perhaps these plans caused God's Archangel, Lucifer, (Isaiah 14:12, KJV), to resist the plan of God to create humans to be able, one day, to rule in heaven with God (Revelation 21:7). In pride and in his anger, I believe Lucifer rebelled against God, and convinced one third of the angels to rebel also (Revelation 12:4 and 7-9). Since the angels could not die, Michael, another Archangel, led the remaining two thirds of the angels to war against Lucifer who became known as Satan or the Devil. Satan and his demons were thrown out of heaven down to earth (Luke 20:35-36) (Revelation 12:7-9).

THE REBELLION STRENGTHENS

Satan, in an effort to frustrate God's plans to make humans to ultimately become sons of God, tempted Eve, through the appearance of a serpent, to sin against God in the Garden of Eden. When she and Adam sinned, evil became an integral part of all humans from that time on. When Adam and Eve sinned they lost their dominion over the earth and Satan became the Prince of the Power of the Air (Genesis 1:26) (John 12:30).

THE REBELLION IS BROKEN BUT NOT DESTROYED

God, who is all knowing, had a backup plan to save the humans He created if they should sin. Because Adam and Eve sinned, all people have become sinners (Romans 3:23). To save them from death (Romans 6:23), God the Son, Jesus, came to a hostile earth, ruled by Satan, to be born as a human, to live a sinless life, then die for all humans of all time. By His resurrection from death, we saw who He really was—the very God of the Universe (John 3:16) (Romans 5:8). By the force of faith in Jesus and joining or accepting Him as Lord of our lives, we are transformed to become the eternal children of God as He had planned from the beginning (Ephesians 1:3-4) (Ephesians 2:8-9) (Acts 16:31) and (Romans 12:2).

THE FIGHT WITH THE REBELLION CONTINUES

Jesus came to earth to die for all humans, but only those who are transformed by the forces of faith and love for Jesus will survive the battle against the darkness of Satan and his demons (John 1:1-5 and 14), (John 14:6 and 15-18), (John 16:7-15). This helper Jesus talked about who would help us survive living on earth is none other than God the Holy Spirit. All Christians are filled with the Holy Spirit at the time of salvation which gives us the power to resist and to defeat Satan and his demons as they tempt us to disobey God.

CHRISTMAS IS THE TURNING POINT AGAINST THE REBELLION

The essence of the Christmas story is found in Luke 2:1-14. The angels appeared to the shepherds to celebrate the birth of God the Son. The angels had told Mary His name would be Jesus and that He who would save sinful people from their sin. He would ultimately regain complete control of the earth which Adam and Eve had lost in the garden of Eden when they sinned. Jesus was the Messiah who had been prophesied in the Old Testament, (Isaiah 9:6-7) as the suffering servant. His future role as that of King of the universe is prophesied in Revelation 11:15.

THE REBELLION WILL BE CRUSHED

The church is a gathering of Christians in a local area and includes all churches of all generations who have accepted Jesus as their Savior together as the Bride of Christ. If we are alive when the rapture occurs, we will escape the seven-year tribulation period. This is a time Satan attempts to resist God's retaking of the earth (1 Thessalonians 4:13-17) (Revelation 19:6-8). The second coming of Jesus will be to crush all rebellion on earth occurs at the end of the tribulation (Revelation 19:11-16) (Zachariah 14:12-15).

THE 1000 YEAR (MILLENNIUM) RULE OF THE KING

The present earth will be ruled for 1000 years with Jesus as King in Jerusalem (Revelation 20:1-6). Satan will be released for a brief time to lead a short rebellion of all people who do not accept Jesus' salvation offered during the millennium. The final blow to the rebellion is the Great White Throne Judgment (Revelation 20:7-16). Satan, all his demons who are fallen angels, and humans who are unbelievers in Jesus, will be cast into a lake of fire. After the old Heaven and the old earth have been destroyed by fire, the New Heaven and the New Earth in eternity future will be the home of all people who have accepted Jesus as their Savior and Lord (Revelation 21:1-5) (Revelation 22: 1-5). January 4
Faith or form – worship or religion

Genesis 4

Children born to Adam and Eve, Cain and Abel, were doubtless taught about God by their parents. We do not know what instructions they were given as to the type of sacrifice they were to offer to God. We do know, however, that Abel's sacrifice was accepted but Cain's was not. If God had required an animal sacrifice, we readily see why Cain's sacrifice was rejected. Hebrews 11:4 says that Abel's sacrifice was accepted because he was demonstrating his faith in God which led him to obey God.

Ezra 4

Enemies of the Jews opposed the rebuilding of the Temple in Jerusalem because, in my opinion, they felt the restoration of the form of Temple worship would bring back the awesome power of the God of the ancient Jewish nation. Most of the Jews, unfortunately, placed Temple worship above true faith in God. What a price the Jewish nation paid by insisting on a form of Temple worship without faith in God.

Psalm 4

David describes the secret of obtaining God's favor and acceptance is faith in God (verse 5).

Psalm 119:25 – 32

In verse 30, this psalmist describes a godly person as one who is acceptable to God because they have chosen to read and to obey God's Word. Faith in God is a choice for which no prescribed form of worship can be substituted.

Proverbs 4

The Amplified Bible describes wisdom as understanding which is discernment and comprehensive insight into the ways and purposes of God. What could be more valuable than this because we know that ultimately God's will be done. Our success will depend on how well we put our faith in Him and choose to be an instrument of carrying out His will for the brief period of time we have on this earth.

Matthew 4

Some 740 years before Jesus' ministry, the prophet Isaiah predicted the joyous awakening of the hope of eternal life by both the Jews and Gentiles when they heard Jesus preaching of the need for repentance of sin and receiving His message of salvation in verses the 13 – 17. Their faith in Jesus, not their form of worship or religion, was the source of their joy. The powerful contrast to the difference between Jesus' message and their former existence was, by comparison, the difference of light and darkness.

Romans 4

The Apostle Paul presents the case that Abraham lived before the law was given through Moses. Still, he was counted righteous because he had faith in God's promises to him and to his descendants (verse 13). The Jewish nation, unfortunately, insisted on being judged by how well they kept the Laws of Moses. How sad they refused the mercy of God through Jesus Christ by holding onto their hopeless attempts to keep God's divine Law in their own sinful state. The law was given through Moses to show the Jews how sinful they were so they would accept their Messiah when He came. This plan was to save them by the substitution of His righteousness through their faith in Him. How sad they tried to substitute their form of Temple worship for faith in their Messiah, Jesus Christ.

Revelation 2:1-7

Evidently the members of the Church at Ephesus were living their lives as a religion and not as having a vibrant relationship with Jesus Christ. When they first believed, they shared a spiritual joy with Jesus who endured the cross by looking forward to the joy He would share with the Father and with us in heaven (Hebrews 12:2).

January 5
The power to preserve

Genesis 5, 6

Noah found grace in the eyes of the Lord because he was righteous (Genesis 6:8). I believe God chose to preserve Noah and his family from drowning in the flood because He desires fellowship with people who put their trust in Him.

Ezra 5

How terrible it must have seemed at the time when the Babylonians took the vessels of silver and gold from the Temple in Jerusalem. In verses 13-15 we see that through the Persian king, Cyrus, God allowed the preserved vessels for Temple worship as well as the remnant of Jews to return to Jerusalem. These vessels would have been scattered or melted down for other use if they had been left in Jerusalem. How great is the precise control God which can bring to bear over world events and leaders when He chooses to preserve what He decides is necessary to carry out His will.

Psalm 5

In verses 11-12, we read that often the joy David expressed to God was for the faithful refuge God gave him. God preserved David and will preserve us today if we seek His guidance for our lives.

Psalm 119:33 – 40

In verse 38 we see that God establishes (preserves) His Word and confirms His promises to us. By His righteousness we get renewed life (verse 40). We are preserved because of our faith in Him.

Proverbs 5

By listening to and following the instruction of loving parents, we, as children, can learn wisdom and understanding, so we are able to exercise proper discretion (verses 1-2). This guidance can preserve the lives of children. By refusing discipline and instruction we can go astray and be lost (verse 23).

Matthew 5

A Christian's attempt to please God with our lives has the preserving power God uses to preserve the culture we live in as salt is used to preserve meat. This righteous living by a Christian can only be done by and through the power of the Holy Spirit working through us to produce righteousness. The presence of the righteousness of God's people is the preserving power which prevents the earth from being putrefied as God found the world in the time of Noah (Genesis 6:12).

Romans 5

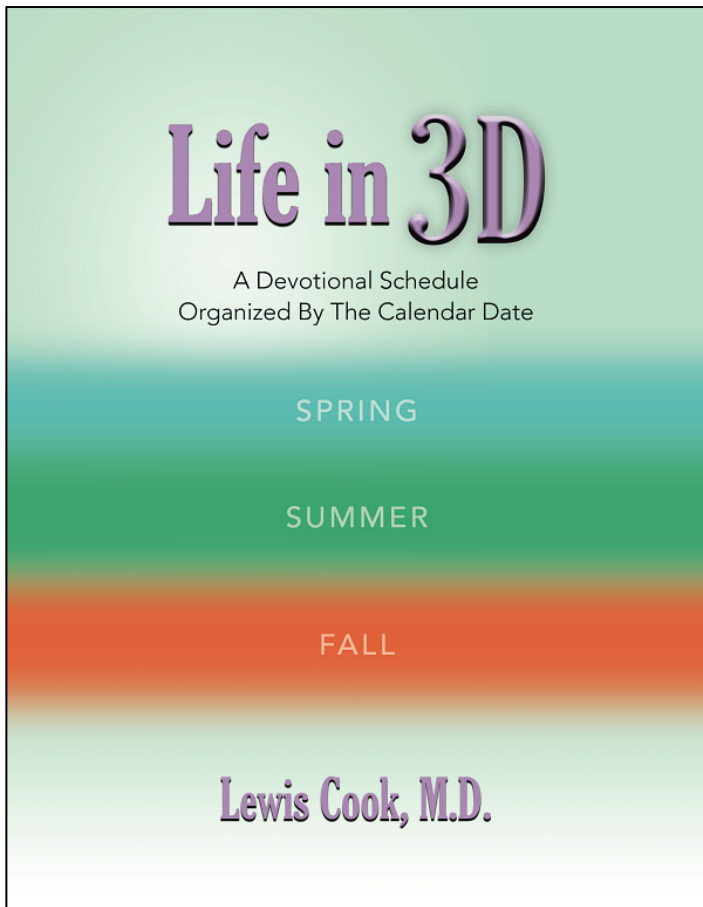
