



Chapter 1: Madison Square Garden

When I was a kid, Madison Square Garden was THE place to see a show, everyone who was at the top of the Music Industry got to play shows there and it was always magical! So when I found out that Prince was bringing his "Hit and Run" tour to my city, I grabbed my Aunt Donna, met my friend Terek on the line, and waited for Prince Tickets outside The Garden for hours! We got the Tickets, and heard later on the radio that it SOLD OUT!

The Concert happened on Aug. 2nd, 1986, it was incredible! The Concert kicked off with the Title Track "Around The World in a Day" and then he immediately preceded to play the first 4 songs of side 1, of his current album "Parade", I'm thinking this guy's good, real good. Wow.

I can only remember certain highlights of this concert, due to it being over 3 decades ago, but things stand out like the long versions of "Head", "Mountains", and "Anotherloverholenyohead", I can't remember what the Encores were, I know "Kiss" was one of them because it was number 1 on the charts. I don't think he closed with "Purple Rain", I'm pretty sure it was "When Doves Cry"! I left the Concert thinking wow, He's great, He's going to last a long time, and I was right! I had no idea, however, about the journey he was about to take me on and how much his life ran parallel to mine for so many years and situations.

There were melodramatic theatrics, such as a tub that Prince laid in while Purple Rain showered him from the roof of the Garden, the band was bigger than it was in the Movie, it contained a horn section, and it was just unbelievable how they played for 3 hours without even taking a break: The Roof Was On Fire! And I got to hear him do Soft and Wet that night, which was his very first Single from his debut album For You.

It left me wanting more, but I definitely felt as if I had witnessed the future of rock and roll, and at a place like The Garden, it was confirmed!

Mick Jagger, David Bowie, Freddie Mercury and Brian May were all in the audience!

Key Point: During the Concert, he would tap any band member on the shoulder and give them a 5 minute break, in which he would play their instrument, so by the end he had played every single instrument on that stage....except the horns, he wasn't good at horns. I had to mention this though 'cause I can't believe I remember it all.

Ticket Buying Experience:

Incredible. Back in those days, we only had Ticketron, there was no Ticketmaster, the Internet wasn't even a thought yet. So we were allowed to camp out overnight outside Madison Square Garden's Box Office on 8th Av. For Prince and the Revolution Tickets when they went onsale!


