Chapter 9:

Seek His Face

She is simply observing the situation. Once satisfied with her own conclusion of what is being asked of her, she will exit the gate. There is no lead rope on her. She moves in her own time and in her own way.

The sheep, however, have a different mentality. I, their shepherd, open the gate and the sheep exit immediately. However, they don't go anywhere. They simply mingle around the me and wait for my next move. They wait for me to lead the way, and then they follow.

I wonder if this is what the Psalmist David was thinking when he wrote Psalm 27. He was a shepherd and understood the ways of

his sheep. Perhaps as he wrote this Psalm, he was thinking of his sheep exiting the gate that morning. His sheep mingled around him, searching his face as they waited for his next move. Each sheep had their eye on their shepherd.

David wrote,

"Your face, Lord, I will seek..."

Psalm 27:8

As his flock surrounded him, they waited for their shepherd's decision as to which path to take that day.

And David wrote,

"Teach me Your way, O Lord; lead me in a straight path..."

Psalm 27:11

Yes, I'm thinking that David's flock showed him what it looked like to wait for their shepherd.

And David wrote,

"Wait on the Lord: be of good courage, and He shall strengthen thine heart:

wait, I say, on the Lord."

Ps. 27:14 (KJV)

What a visual I have each morning as I watch this scenario again and again!

My sheep are not disappointed when they seek my face for direction. As they exit their gate and mingle around me, I reward them by leading them to the desired location where they are provided all they need to be healthy and strong.




When I am seeking my Great Shepherd's face for direction, for clarity, for wisdom, I am not disappointed. He provides all that I need to be strong in Him.
