DEDICATION

This book is dedicated¹ to all the congregants who worshipped God and served Christ in the community in this building since 1879 when the First Baptist of South Chicago was chartered². Subsequently, it was a glorious day when these early English-speaking immigrants and first-generation Americans celebrated the opening of their House of God in 1885.

Similarly, this work is dedicated to the early immigrant, emigrants, and first-generation Mexicans who in 1926 established their Spanish-speaking in the building they co-shared the premises for almost three decades with the English-speaking Baptist congregation. The Mexican congregation used their initial name of *Primera Iglesia Bautista Mexicana de Sur Chicago* (First Mexican Baptist Church of South Chicago). In the 1930s, they changed their name to, *Iglesia Bautista El Salvador* (El Salvador Baptist Church).

In 1953, the First Baptist Church of South Chicago moved to another nearby neighborhood. Consequently, the Mexican Baptist congregation had the opportunity to purchase the building and one parcel of land and moved forward with God's providence. It changed its name again in a later years to *Primera Iglesia Bautista El Salvador*. Then in the 1960s, the Mexican Baptist Church changed its name to *Iglesia Bautista Del Salvador* (Del Salvador Baptist Church), which was its final name. This book is about these men and women and their work in South Chicago.

I am glad to have been able to find some scarce documentation about the history of the Mexican Baptist leaders, their ministry and activities. They were more than a singular sentence reference in the history of the Baptist work in South Chicago. Their history reveals how they struggled and succeeded in spreading the Gospel through their sixty-five year Christian ministry from 1926-1991 when it ceased its religious services as a congregation.

Their legacy is a glorious story of Believers representing men, women, children, and youth. They were unabashed for Christ in the challenging environs of South Chicago and nearby communities and other states. I was a humble servant here during some of these years and am honored to share this long overdue narrative.
