
Rod's work on The Courageous Princess at Antarctic Press earned him a nomination for "Promising new talent" and "Best artist" for the 2000 Ignatz Awards and a 2002 Eisner Award nomination for "Best Title for Younger Readers". He authored the Neotopia series (4 volumes, 140 pages each). In 2006, Novotopia, the German edition of Neotopia, got a nomination for the Max und Moritz Prize in the category 'Bester Comic für Kinder' (best comic book for younger audience).
