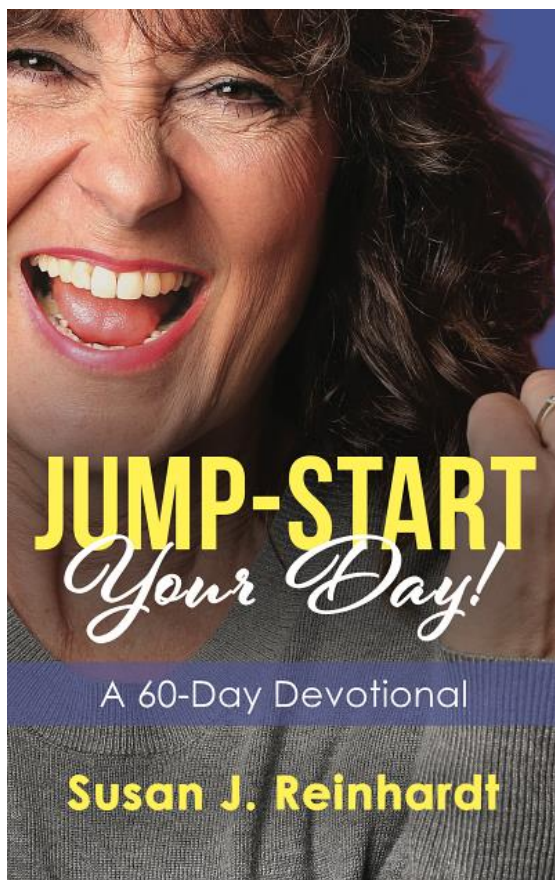
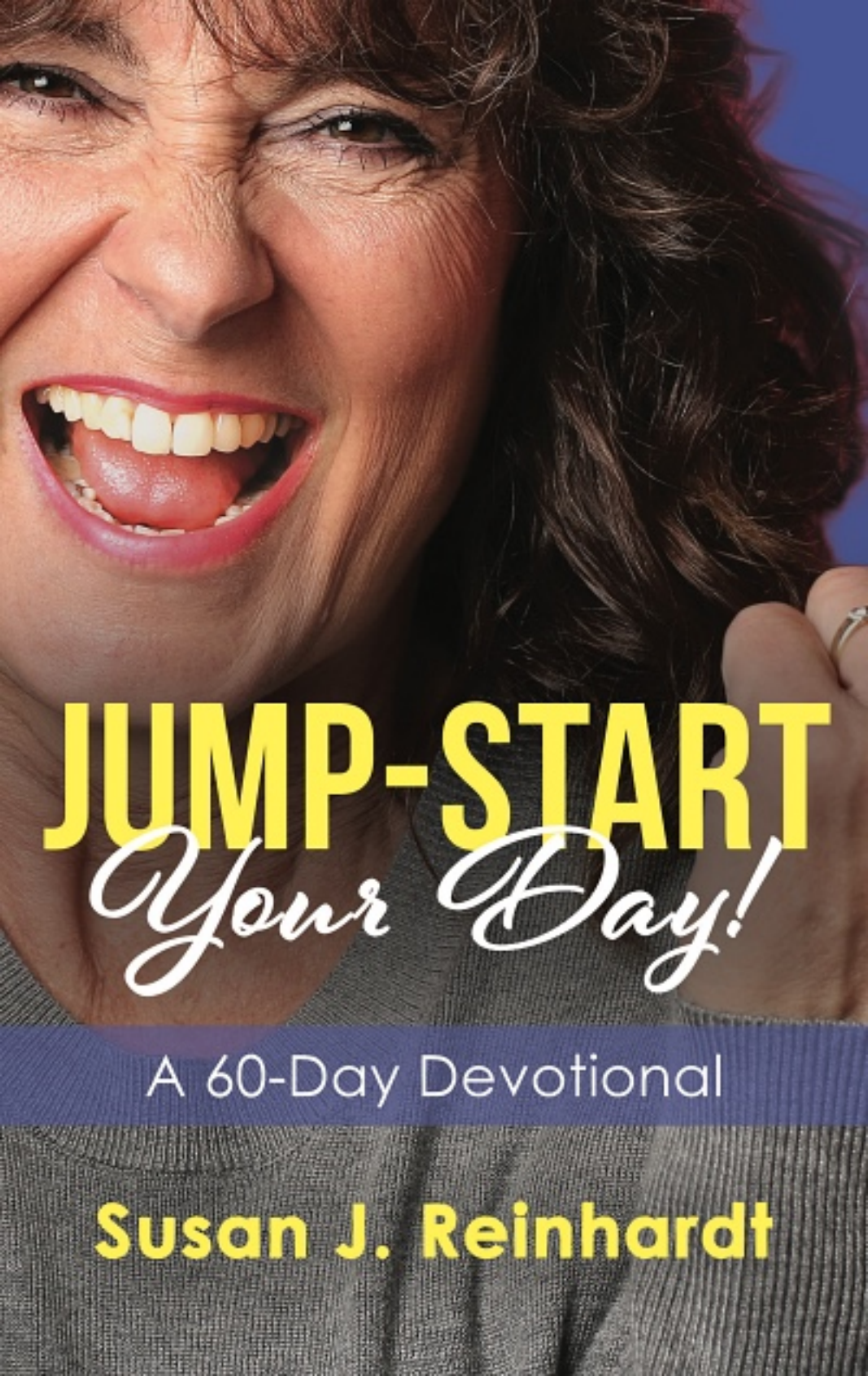

ALL IN

Are you “all in?” Lately, this two-word phrase keeps popping up online and elsewhere. It describes an individual who is fully committed, whether to a relationship, a job, a task, or a cause.

When attending school, an answer of “present” when the teacher called my name didn't qualify as being “all in.” Only paying attention to instruction, completing assignments and homework, and studying for tests evidenced a commitment to excellence.

How do we show that we're “all in,” particularly in our relationship with the Lord?

1. Relationship with the Lord means aligning ourselves with God's Word, talking (praying) to Him daily, caring for others in the Body of Christ, and loving our neighbors.

Jesus asked the rich, young ruler what the greatest commandments were. He gave the correct answer. Unfortunately, when Jesus told the young man what was required of him, he walked away. He wasn't ready to be “all in.”

Luke 18:23-24 (KJV) – “And when he heard this, he was very sorrowful; for he was very rich. And when Jesus saw that he was very sorrowful, he said, How hardly shall they that have riches enter into the kingdom of God!” NOTE: Please read this in context - verses 18-30. Jesus is NOT talking against rich people.

2. “All in” speaks of passion. Are we merely giving the Lord a positive nod or are we actively seeking His will for our lives, renewing our minds with the Word of God, and allowing Him to call the shots?

Romans 12:1-2 (KJV) – “I beseech you therefore, brethren, by the mercies of God, that ye present your bodies a living sacrifice, holy, acceptable unto God, which is your reasonable service. And be not conformed to this world: but be ye transformed by the renewing of your mind, that ye may prove what is that good, and acceptable, and perfect, will of God.”

3. Finally, “all in” speaks of a life that is connected and living to glorify our Savior.

Scripture: Colossians 2:6-7 (KJV) says, “As you have received Christ Jesus the Lord, so walk in him. Rooted and built up in him and stablished in the faith, as ye have been taught, abounding therein with thanksgiving.”

Application: Where do we stand? Are we “all in” or are we still holding onto our own way of doing things?

Prayer: Father, forgive us when we allow ourselves to drift or grow cold in our walk with You. We draw near to You, and we desire that You would draw near to us. In Jesus’ name, amen.

SIMPLE THINGS FIRST

My late husband repaired commercial water softeners. When a client called, he would ask them, “Did you check the strainer?” He saved many companies from costly service calls with that one question. This lesson can be applied to many areas of life.

Everyone who uses a computer can relate to the command: Restart. When a computer is acting weird, turn it off, and then turn it on again. Most of the time, that solves the problem.

When things go awry in our lives, a quick inventory of the “simple things” can save a lot of time and frustration.

Feeling down in the dumps?

What have I been meditating on? The vaguely disturbing movie I watched before bedtime didn't help matters. Did a news item, or a casual comment from someone, affect my mood?

Am I snapping at everyone around me? Oops, I jumped into my busy day and forgot to spend time with Jesus.

Is my stomach in knots? Ugh, worrying about that interview isn't good for the digestion.

Scripture: Philippians 4:6-8 (KJV) – “Be careful for nothing; but in every thing by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known unto God. And the peace of God, which passeth all understanding, shall keep your hearts and minds through Christ Jesus. Finally, brethren,

whatsoever things are true, whatsoever things are honest, whatsoever things are just, whatsoever things are pure, whatsoever things are lovely, whatsoever things are of good report: if there be any virtue, and if there be any praise, think on these things.”

Application: It's the simple things that often trip us up. Some minor adjustments and a dose of the Word of God can set things right in a hurry.

Prayer: Father, may I be sensitive to the leading of Your Holy Spirit and pay attention to the simple things that impact the future. In Jesus' name, amen.

IN THE JOY OF THE LORD

Prior to meeting in person, my late husband and I corresponded by email. He always signed his emails with, “In the Joy of the Lord.” I'd never heard of anyone using that phrase over their signature.

As we got to know each other, I learned this expressed his personality to a “T.” He was joyful through so many situations that would send others into depression.

Even when he was diagnosed with leukemia several years later, he remained steady in his faith and did not allow it to get him down. I remember him walking around the oncology floor in the hospital and stopping to give a cheery word to another patient having a hard time. When my beloved husband spoke of the Lord, they listened because they saw his upbeat attitude despite his condition.

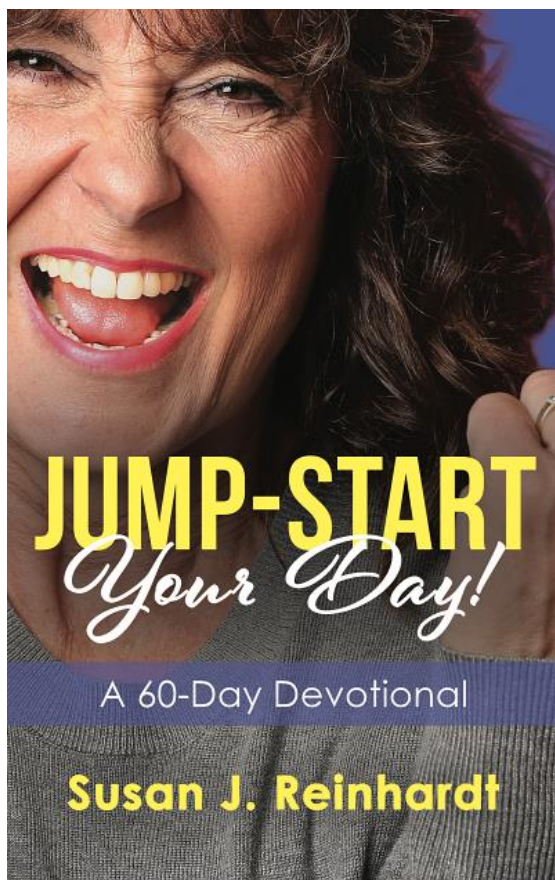
Jesus walked through this life in joy. He didn't allow the challenges of the Pharisees and Sadducees to frustrate or discourage him. When faced with the cross, He settled the matter between Himself and God, the Father. Once that was done, He went through that horrendous time looking forward to the joy that was set before Him.

Scripture: Nehemiah 8:10 (KJV) – “Then he said unto them, go your way, eat the fat, and drink the sweet, and send portions unto them for whom nothing is prepared: for this day is holy unto our Lord: neither be ye sorry; for the joy of the Lord is your strength.”

Application: Not only is walking in joy a great example to others, but it keeps us focused on our God, the Creator of heaven and earth. As we choose to do this, we find strength amid life's storms and hope for the future.

Feeding on the Word and being around others who are strong in the Lord keeps our hard times from looking bigger than God. Stay encouraged and walk “in the joy of the Lord.”

Prayer: Lord, when we're tempted to allow our emotions or circumstances to rule our lives, please remind us that it's Your joy that gives us strength. In Jesus' name, amen.



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
