AIR: a mixture of nitrogen, oxygen, and minute amounts of other gases that sur round the earth and form its atmosphere. *The air* seems to be filled with electricity. **HEIR**: a person who inherits or has a right of inheritance in the property of another following the latter's death. *He is the heir* to the family's fortune.

<u>AISLE</u>: a walkway between or along sections of seats in a theater, classroom, or the like. Her father walked her down the **aisle** when she married.

I'LL: contraction of "I will". I'll cook the dinner for the celebration.

ALL: the whole of, every. Pack all of those supplies together.

ISLE: a small island. She vacationed on an isle in the Caribbean.

AWL: a pointed instrument for piercing small holes in leather, wood, etc. *He used the awl to punch another hole in his belt.*

ALLOWED: to give permission to or for; permit. Were you **allowed** to go to the fair? **ALOUD**: vocally, as distinguished from mentally. He gave his presentation **aloud**.



ALLUDE: to refer casually or indirectly, a casual or indirect reference. Her comments **alluded** to an earlier discussion..

ELUDE: to avoid or escape by speed, cleverness or trickery. He tried to **elude** the speeding car.

ANT: any of numerous black, red, brown, or yellow social insects. *I have never* been on a picnic where I didn't see at least one **ant**.

AUNT: the sister of one's father or mother. Her aunt came to visit her last week.

ATE: having eaten or digested. The weary travelers ate in silence.

EIGHT: a cardinal number, seven plus one. Joan will be **eight** years old tomorrow.

AYE: an affirmative vote or voter, esp. in British Parliament. At last count, the vote was one **aye** and three nays.

EYE: the organ of sight. The wind blew dirt into his **eye**.

<u>I</u>: the ninth letter of the English alphabet, a vowel. *I will call your office on Tuesday.*

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
