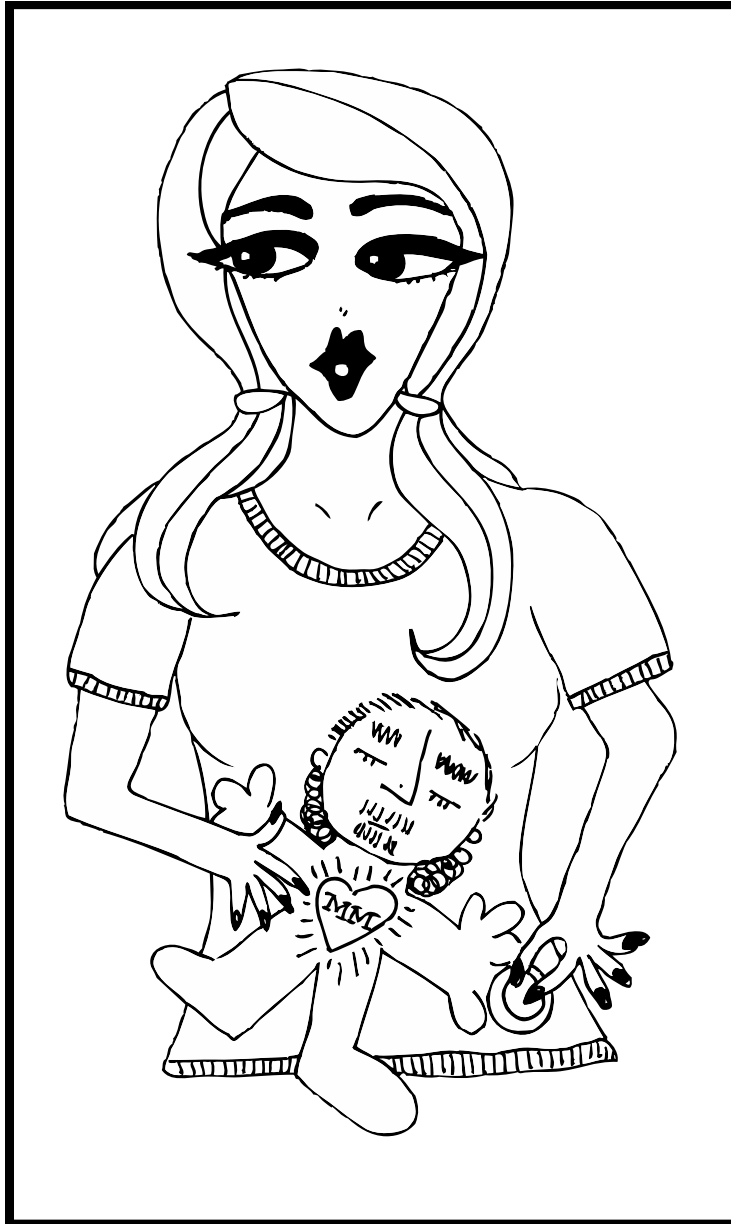
I knew I was headed for an undetermined amount of disaster when my best friend had decided she wanted to marry her boyfriend. I was sure he knew as she made it very clear to

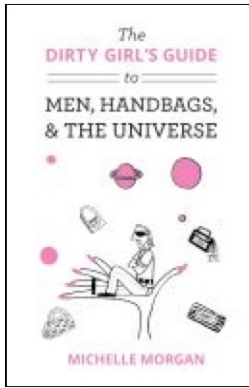
