



How can courage to try be separated from courage to fail? Both are absolutely necessary for success to prevail.





taught the Microcosmos Strand at the University of Connecticut's Confratute – an intense summer program attended by teachers and parents of gifted and talented students from all over the world.

Her first book of collected poems, *Watching Ants*, was created at the request of Irving Sato, Director of the National/State Leader Training Institute on the Gifted and Talented, Ventura, California in 1989.
